1. A — Respect for the freedom and dignity of the individual

Australia values respect for the freedom and dignity of every individual.

2. A — Freedom of religion and a secular government

Australia has freedom of religion and a secular government; people may follow any religion or none.

3. A — Yes, freedom of speech is a core Australian value

Freedom of speech lets people peacefully express opinions, including criticism of the government, within the law.

4. A — Yes, men and women have equal rights

Equality of men and women is a fundamental Australian value; both have equal rights under the law.

5. A — Everyone has equality of opportunity

'A fair go' refers to equality of opportunity — what you achieve comes from your effort and talents, not your background.

6. A — No, Australians value peaceful disagreement and the rule of law

Australians resolve disagreements peacefully and through the law; violence is never an acceptable response.

7. A — Yes, all people are treated equally under the law

Equality under the law means the law applies to everyone equally, regardless of status, wealth or background.

8. A — To obey the laws of Australia

Everyone in Australia must obey Australian laws.

9. A — English is the national language and helps people take part in society

English is Australia's national language; learning it helps people participate fully in the community, education and work.

10. A — No, religious freedom and mutual respect are valued

Australia values religious freedom, tolerance and mutual respect; discrimination based on religion is not acceptable.

11. A — People can join or not join any lawful group or organisation

Freedom of association means people may join, or choose not to join, any lawful group, such as a union, club or political party.

12. A — Parliamentary democracy and the rule of law

Australians support parliamentary democracy and the rule of law as the basis of government.

13. A — With tolerance and mutual respect

Tolerance, mutual respect and compassion for others — including those with different views — are Australian values.

Respecting others' rights includes letting them express different opinions and practise their own beliefs peacefully.

In Australia people are free to choose their own marriage partner; forced marriage is against the law.

19. A — Government is not based on any one religion

A secular government means the government is separate from religion and does not favour any particular religion.

20. A — A person's effort, hard work and talents

Equality of opportunity means everyone has a fair chance to succeed based on their effort and ability, not their background.

21. A — Yes, mutual respect for all people is valued

Australia is a multicultural society that values mutual respect for people of all cultural backgrounds.

22. A — No, people are free to follow any religion or none

Freedom of religion means no one can be forced to follow a religion; people may also choose to have no religion.

23. A — Work peacefully and lawfully to change it

If you disagree with a law you can work peacefully and lawfully to change it, but you must still obey it.

24. A — Helping people who are vulnerable or disadvantaged

Compassion for those in need — supporting the vulnerable and disadvantaged — is an Australian value.

25. A — Yes, women and men have equal rights to participate

Equality of men and women means both can fully participate in society, including work, education and politics.

26. A — People from many backgrounds live together with mutual respect

Australia is a peaceful, multicultural society where people of many backgrounds live together with mutual respect.

27. A — No, it must stay within the law and not harm others

Freedom of speech operates within the law; it does not permit defamation, threats, or incitement of violence or hatred.

Peacefulness is an Australian value; differences should be settled through discussion and lawful means, not violence.
